

#### WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU COME BACK TO SCHOOL

Preparations for school are easy! All you need are a water bottle, cost, hat, wnoream (optional) and your lunch if you have a packed lunch. No bags, no hand scritter – we've got you covered!





Look out for your class sign which will tell you what gate to come in. This will be the same gate every day. An adult will be waiting for you and tell you where you need to go. Everything will be labelled to help you as your way. Staff have been studying very hard for all your questions so if you are not sure just adult.

If year grown up needs to speak to someone in the office, they can call or ensal. If they really need to speak to someone face to face, they can line up on our one-way system. The office will be open to parents/guardians between 10 cm & 2 pm.



You may need to line up (on a special sport) before your teacher leads you into your learning space, which will look a bit different. You'll be asked to wash your hands before you sit at your deck. You will have your very own desk and resource pack to there's no need to bring anything with you (oh good, less to earry!) There will still be time to talk and interest with your friends and ask an amany questions as you wish. This will be your Bubble.

Your teacher will deliver lessons in the classroom as normal and should you need any support they will give it to you. We are not robots (we don't live in cupboards or need charjegt) if you are finding it hard, that's sk! There will be daily SSHCS sessions so you can discuss any warries with your grown up.
