We are very proud of all the pupils who took part in the phonics screening assessments. They did amazingly well and as a school we achieved a **94%** pass rate. In January 2020 we introduced the Read Write Inc. phonics scheme across KS1 and KS2 from September 2020. It has had fantastic results and the staff and pupils have fully embraced the scheme. Staff ensure that they keep up to date with the Read Write Inc. training schedule, continually refining their practice. We would like to thank you for your hard work and practice at home during 'lockdown' and beyond.

GOLDEN TICKETS!







COVID GUIDANCE

It is inevitable at this time of year that there are lots of other seasonal viral infections in circulation. Your child does not need a test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell but do not have a temperature, cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste.

The symptoms of Covid-19 are: A high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back.

A new, continuous cough - this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual).

A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste - this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

We have been asked by Herts County Council to remind parents and carers that to knowingly ignore the self-isolation guidance is breaking the law and they could be fined £1,000, you can find the latest Government information at: https://www.gov.uk/government/news/new-legal-duty-to-self-isolate-comes-into-force-today

If you are unsure whether to get a test, please check the official list of symptoms on the NHS website, which is reviewed regularly: www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/symptoms/

Only the person with symptoms should get a test. You do not need to get a test for anyone else in the household unless they present with any of the three symptoms listed above. All members of the household need to self-isolate whilst waiting for the test result.

If the person with symptoms' test comes back positive, other members of their household should continue self isolating for 14 days and only get a test if they develop coronavirus symptoms. If a pupil in a class or bubble tests positive for coronavirus, anyone who is advised to self isolate does not require a test unless they subsequently develop symptoms.
