Thank you to the parents who attended the Willows and Rowans coffee morning this week. It is nice for us all to be able to see other grown ups - even if it is virtually.

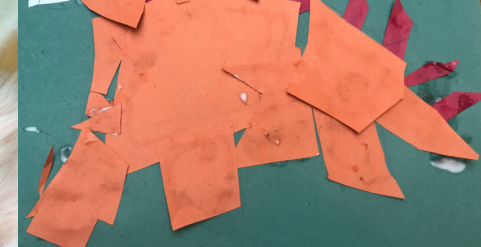
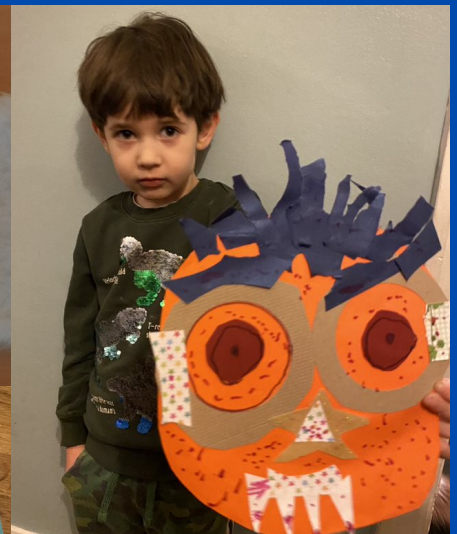
Silver Birches and Oaks class coffee morning will be on Wednesday and Thursday next week. Please email the school office if you wish to attend so you can be sent a link.

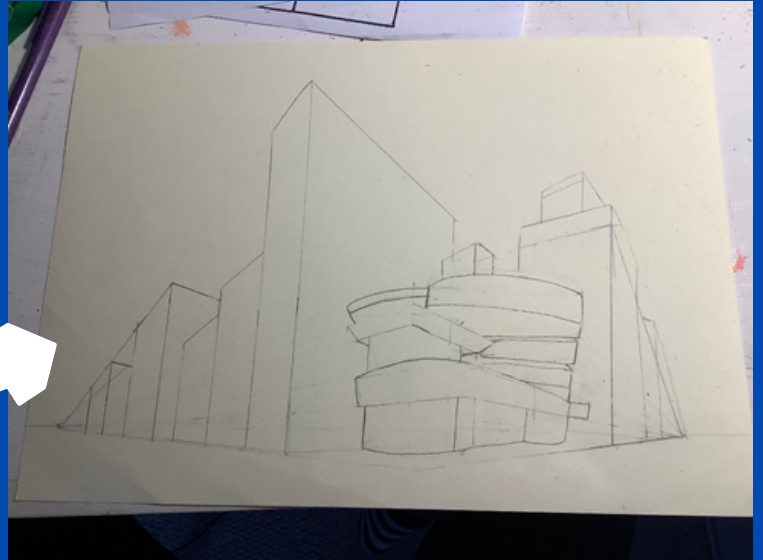
