

A MESSAGE FROM MRS ADSHEAD

We have had a few enquiries from parents this week regarding when pupils will be able to mix again with other classes at breaktime. Unfortunately, the Government has only slightly altered the guidance to schools and for Primary settings there is virtually no change. We like many of you are frustrated that the changes in the wider community does not seem to match what is happening in school. We will keep you updated should the guidance change further.

I would like to remind parents and guardians of our expectations around packed lunches and breaktime snacks. We are a nut free school, we have several children with severe nut allergies. If your child has food that contains nuts it will be removed from their packed lunch and substituted with a school lunch if appropriate. We also request that pupils lunch boxes do not contain chocolate bars or packets of sweets. Pupils in all classes are able to bring in a health snack consisting of a piece of fruit or a vegetable snack. No other snacks are allowed at breaktime.


I like listening to the birds and this is a bird flying and singing. It's a robin









LEARNING IN THE OAKS
