Testing ... testing!

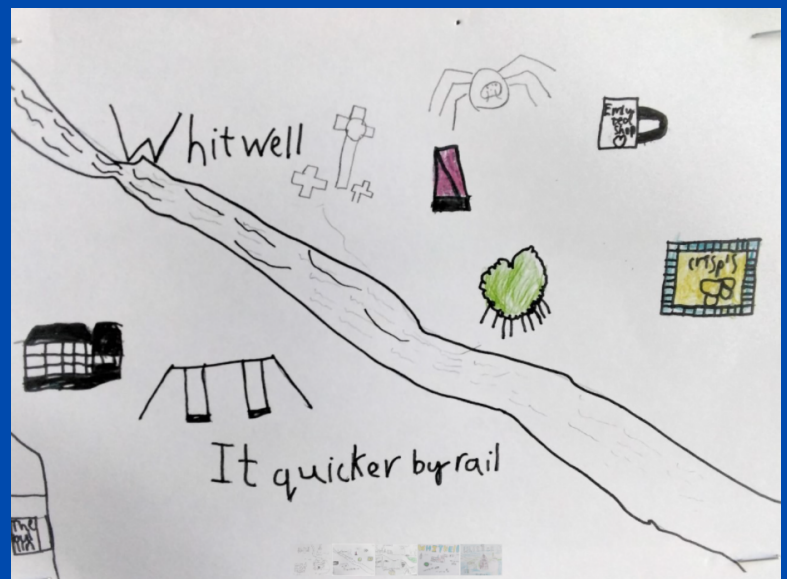
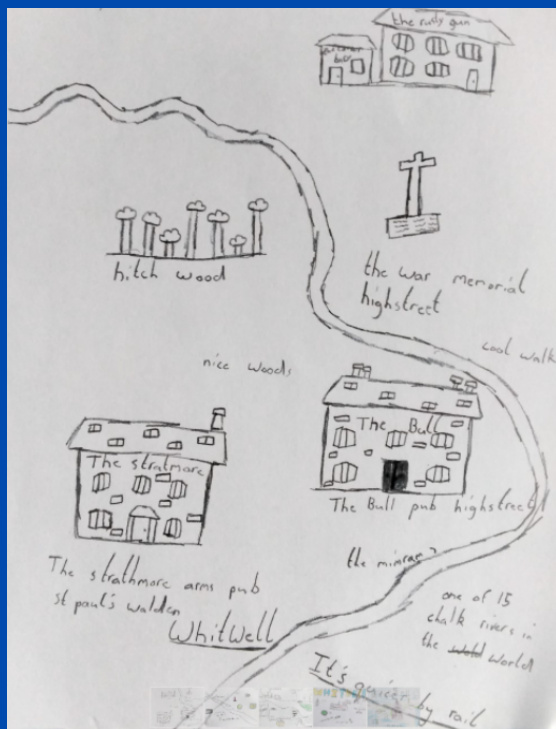
The Rowans are testing their materials to build an Anderson shelter. They used force meters with weights to determine whether their shelter would withstand different pressures applied depending on their chosen material.

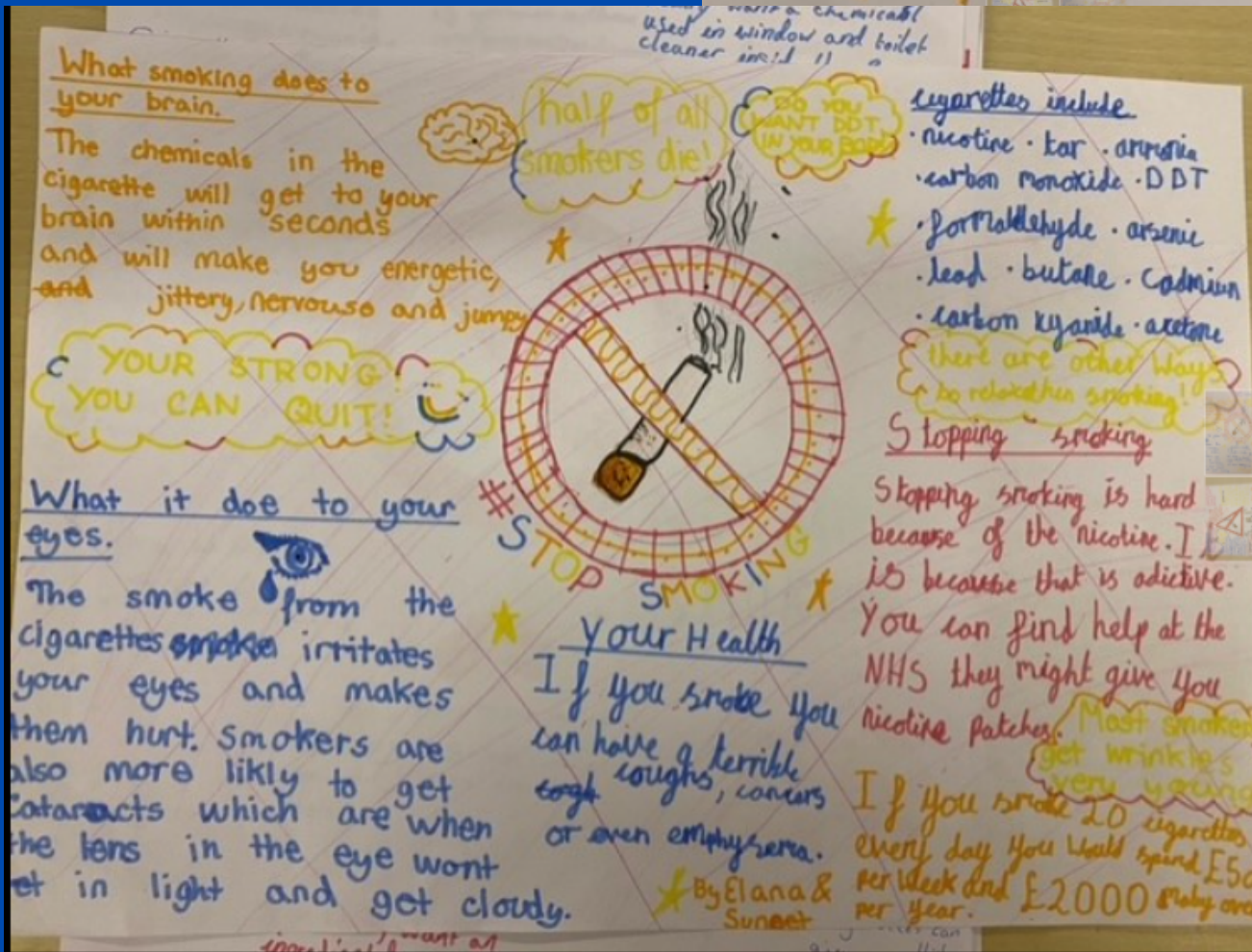
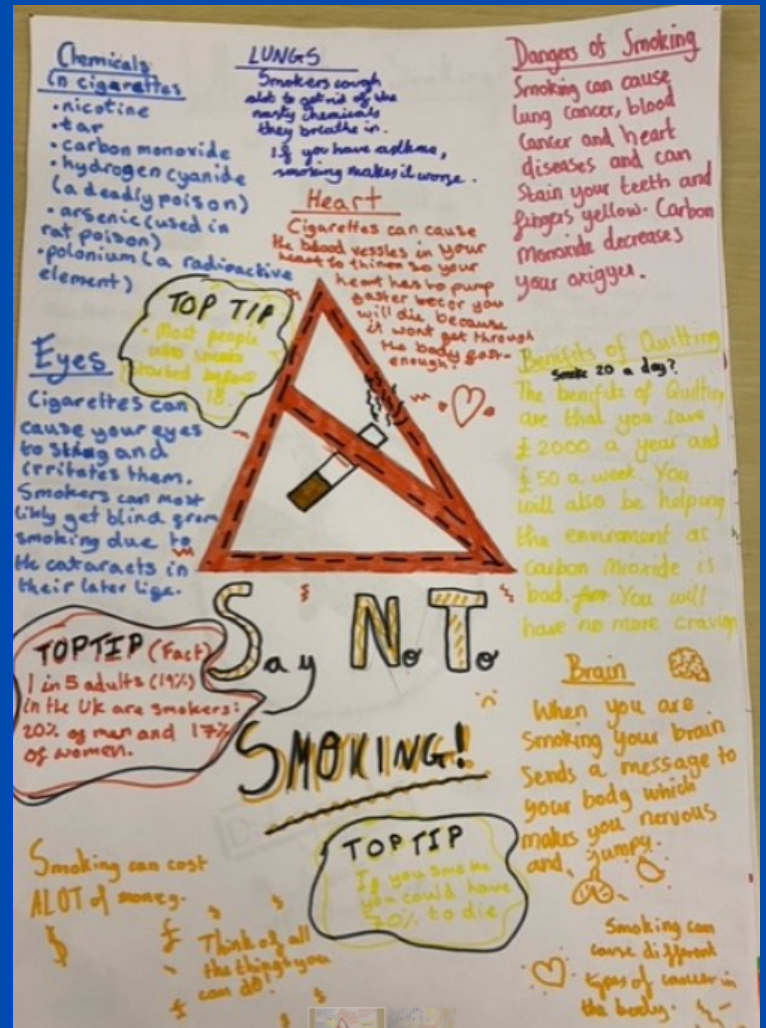

Leuna: Queen of Puppies

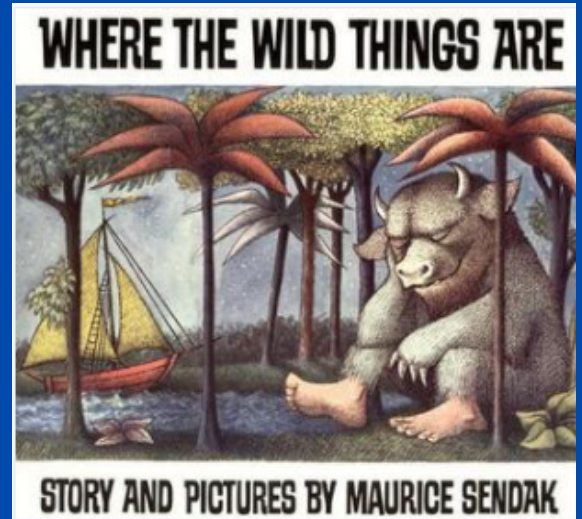
Sophia: Queen of Sellotape!

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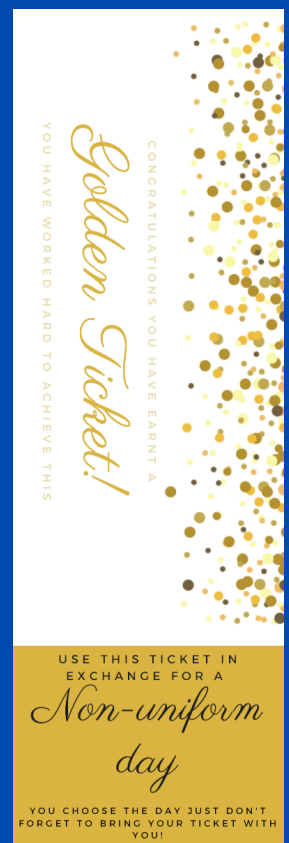
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Reminders
