This meant they had to twist elastic bands or string around tightly and anything interesting they found as they walked around the outside area, they could attach to the stick. This way, they could remember their whole journey by looking at all the little leaves, seed shells and other interesting items. They took their sticks so they could add their memories on their way home.



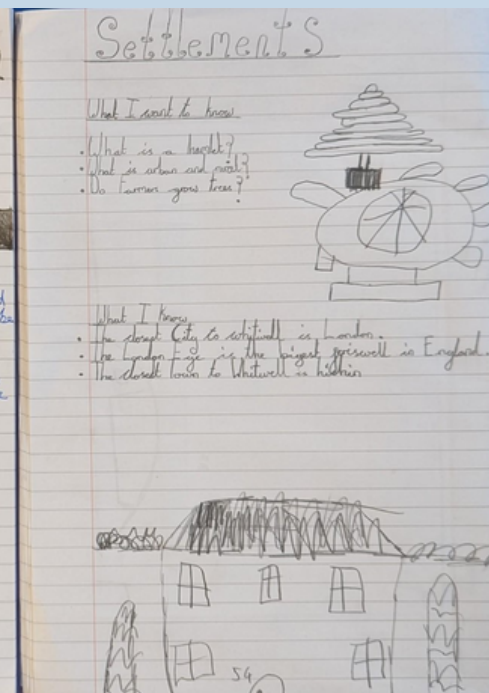
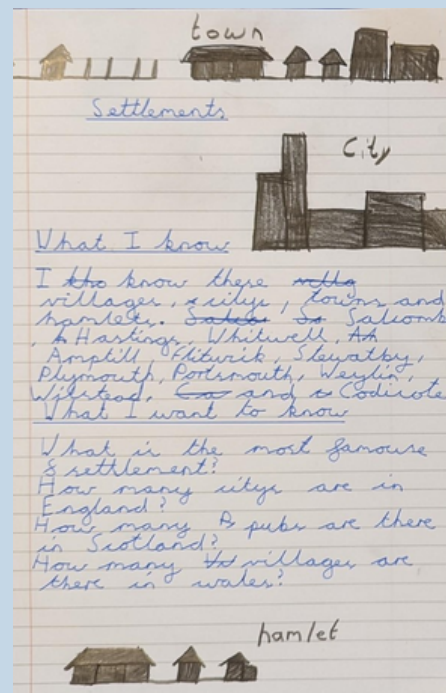
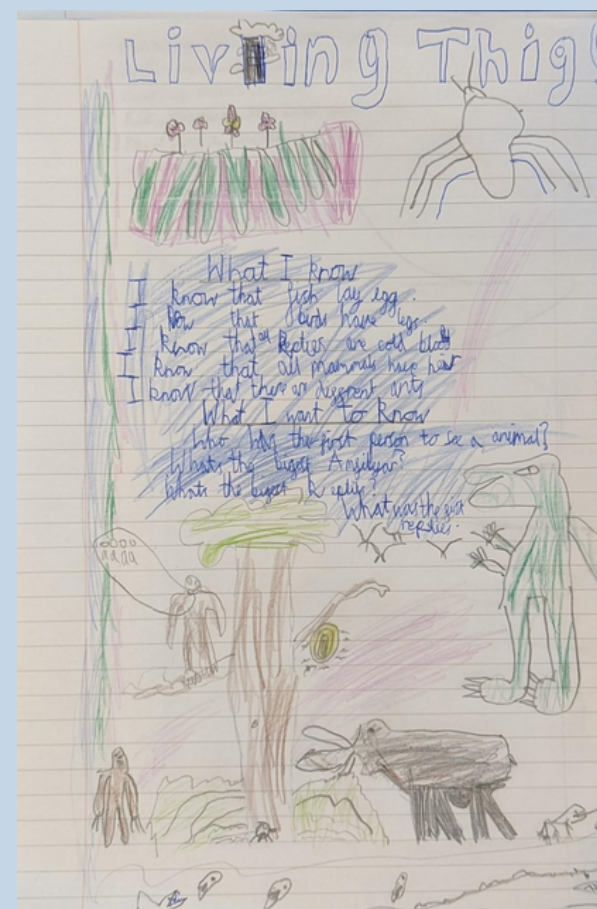
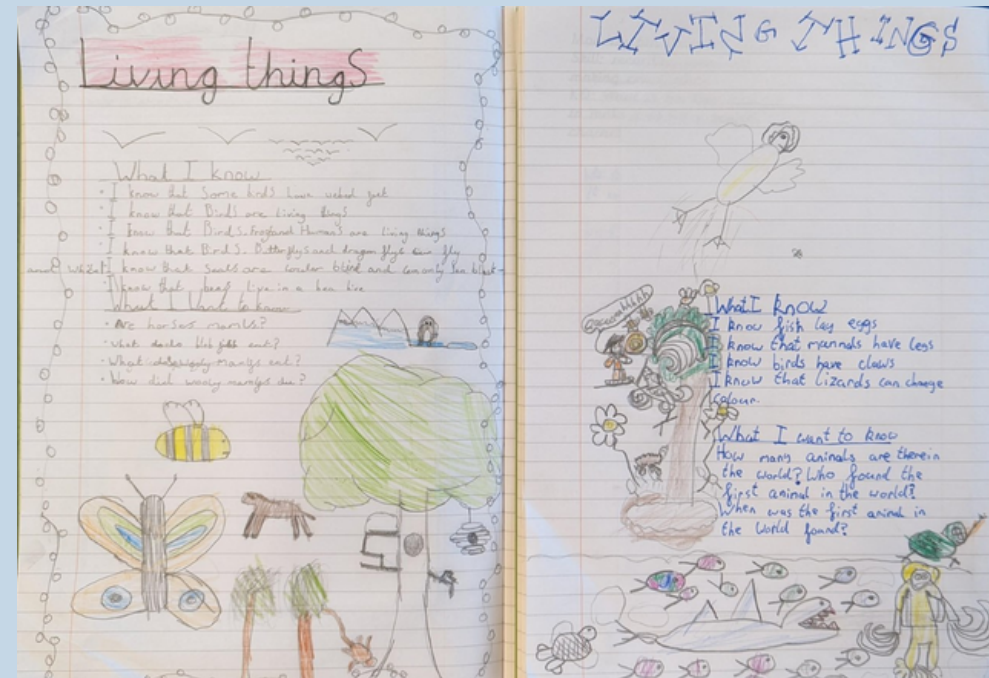
LEARNING IN THE ROWANS

The Rowans have started their topic on Wildlife in Art this half term. Check out their lions drawn from pastels and using string for the lion's manes. Don't they look fierce?



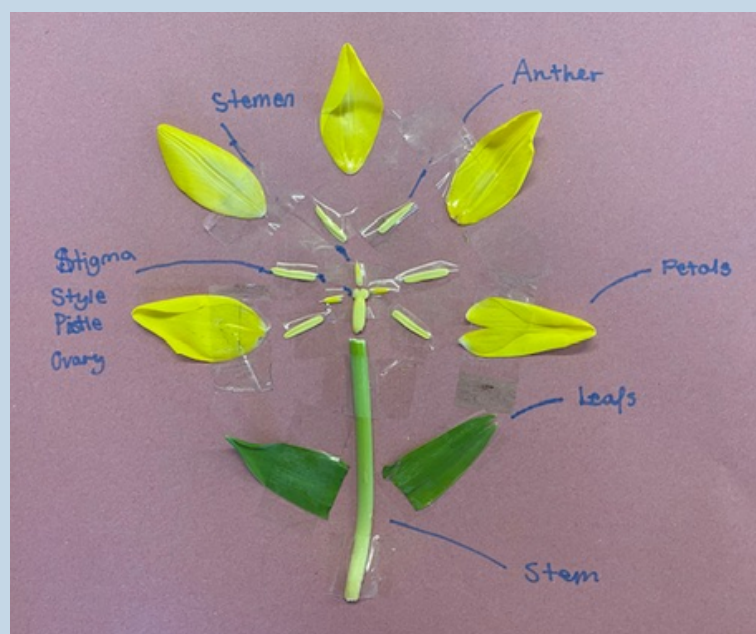
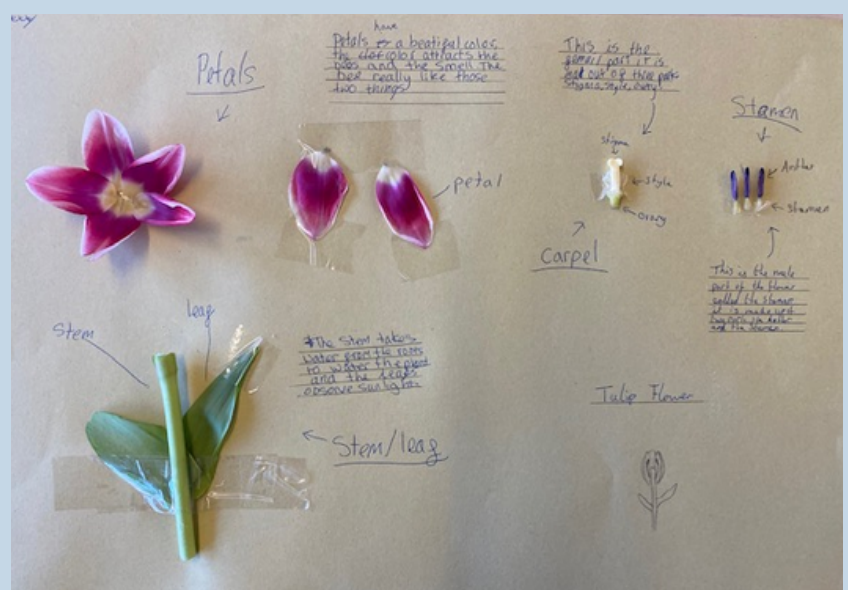
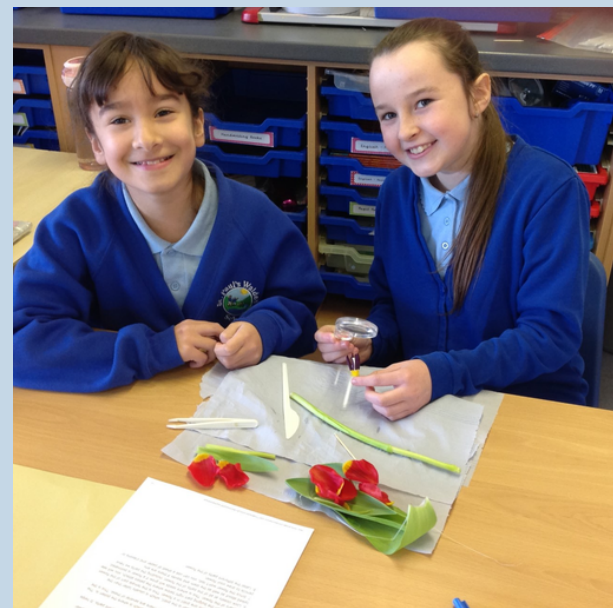
LEARNING IN THE SILVER BIRCHES

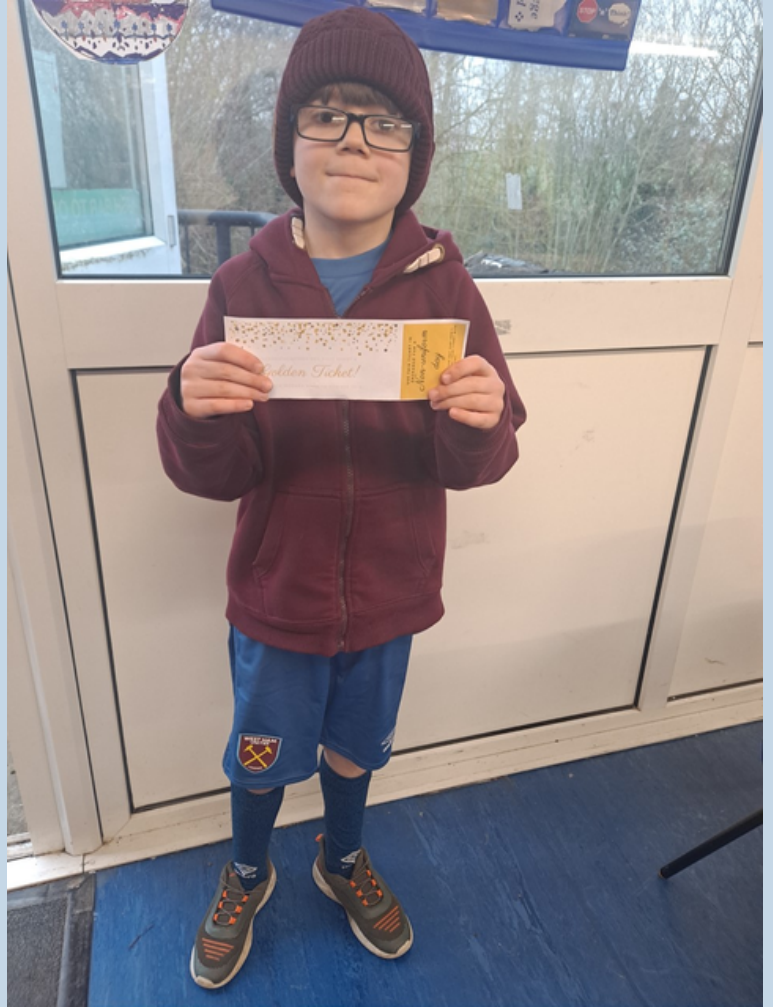
LEARNING IN THE OAKS

We would like to share the following information with you:

We will still be required to send children home if they have a positive PCR/LFD result or symptoms of Covid-19. They and their households are required to comply with <https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance/stay-at-home-guidance-for-households-with-possible-coronavirus-covid-19-infection>

A positive LFD test requires a confirmatory PCR in the usual way and children/young people are expected to isolate pending the result. If negative, they can return to school. If positive they must comply with Stay at Home Guidance as above.

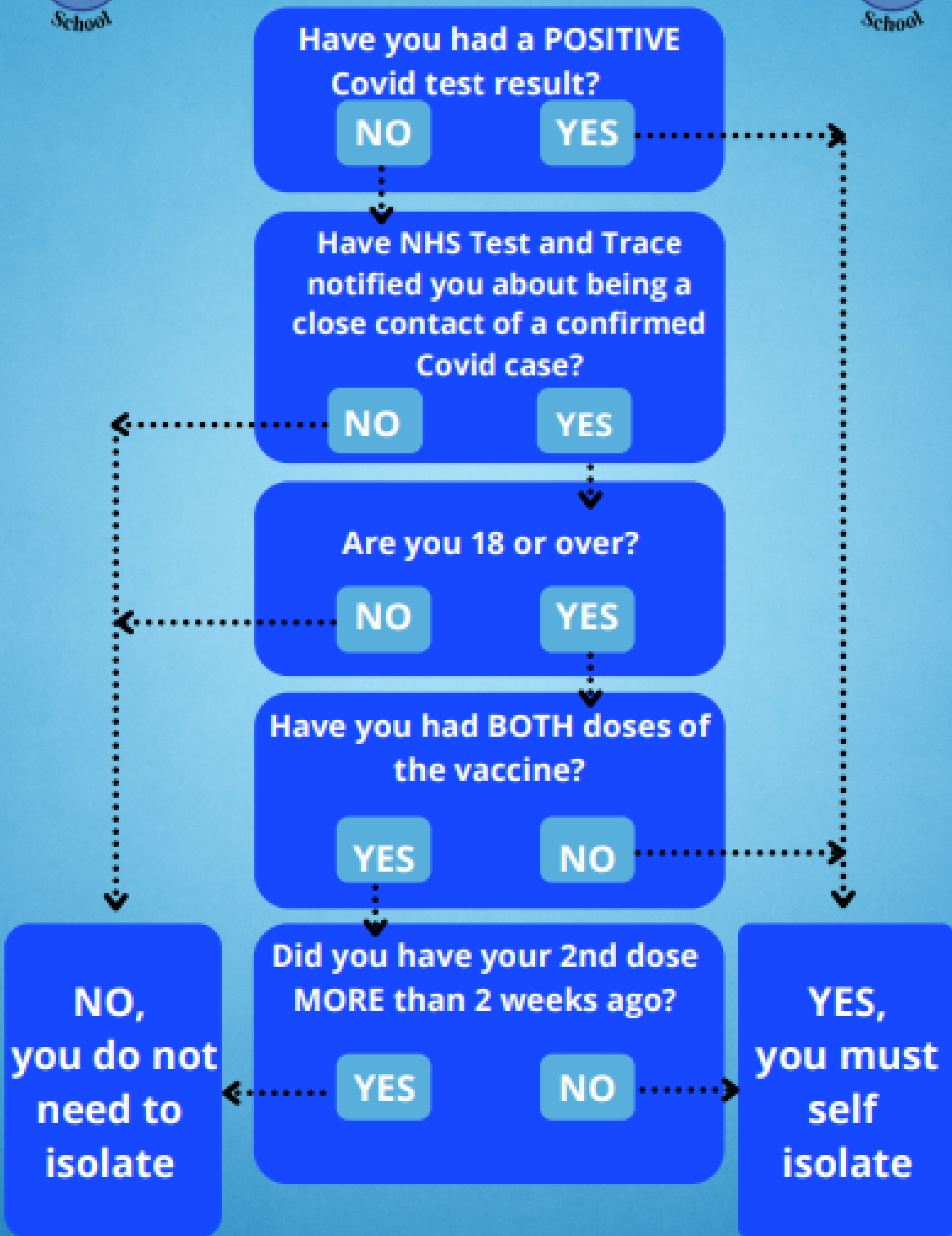

Hitchin Christmas Community Team 2021



2021 marked our 7th year of giving hampers to families and individuals in Hitchin and the surrounding villages. Originally we gave out food hampers with everything needed for a Christmas meal including meat/alternative, fresh vegetables, gravy, stuffing, chocolate logs, etc. along with presents for the children. We joined as a group to minimise the duplication of support across our area. In 2015 we provided 78 food hampers. With all the uncertainty of 2020 we were amazed with the generosity of our community as we moved to virtual hampers by providing

supermarket vouchers rather than a food parcel. Following positive feedback, we made the decision to continue with supermarket vouchers. This gives families the dignity to choose food suitable for their households and at times that suits them it also gave us the flexibility to plan without the worry of any imposed restrictions. This decision meant that fundraising was essential and again we are amazed by the kindness of our local community enabling us to support 160 families with a weekly shop and gifts for their children. As you will see from the feedback we received this extra support makes a real difference to our families. We are grateful to everyone involved.
