

#### LEARNING IN THE WILLOWS












#### LEARNING IN THE SILVER BIRCHES





#### LEARNING IN THE OAKS


Oaks class have been recapping on SPAG this week including word classes. Our main writing has focused on information texts; you can see some good examples of our work here. Well done



## PUPIL PREMIUM AND FREE SCHOOL MEALS

As we are all aware things are getting more expensive and every little helps!

We have included information about how you can apply for extra support for your child in school, When you apply for free school meals, not only does your child receive a free dinner should you wish they also get extra funding that we can use to support your child in school. Examples of this are subsidising school trips, employing additional staff to fund small group teaching, supporting music lessons and funding for extra-curricular activities.

I would encourage everyone to consider if they are eligible to apply regardless of which year your child is in.

#### Registering for Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM)

All parents/carers of children are can register their child for Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM). This register will then be used to check for eligibility for the pupil premium grant. The pupil premium grant provides additional funds within the school budget to enable us to support those children who are eligible in school.

To receive universal free school meals for your child, you can call 0300 123 4048 to register. The lines are open 8.00am-8.00pm Monday to Friday and 9.00am to 4.00pm on Saturday. Alternatively, you can follow the link below to complete this form online. Complete the form and click "Submit Form". You will need your National Insurance Number in order to do this.

Alternatively, our school office staff can register for you. All we need is the parent's date of birth, National Insurance number and a signature to give us permission to do so. If you would like the school to register on your behalf, please contact the office and they will provide you with a form so that this can be done for you.
