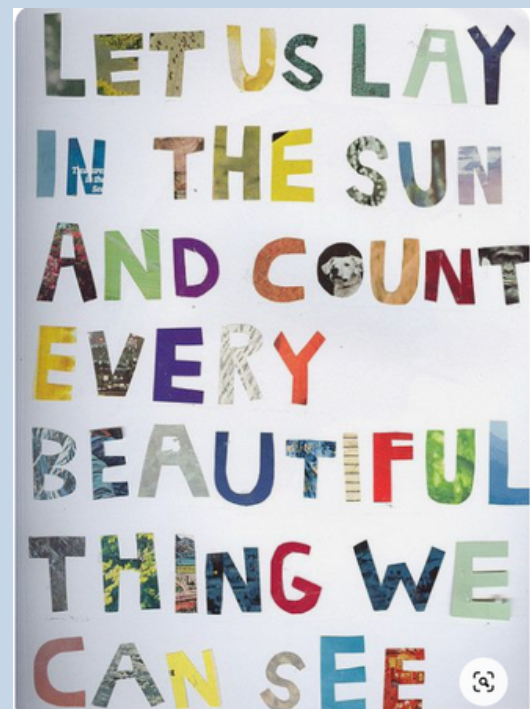
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LEARNING IN THE WILLOWS



LEARNING IN THE SILVER BIRCHES




In RE this half term we have been looking at the Jewish festival of Passover. We have investigated what food is eaten or displayed to celebrate and remember this time. Each piece of food is significant on the Seder Plate and reminds Jews about the past struggles of Israelites when they were escaping Egypt and the evil Pharaoh with the help of God.

Ze'ro'a - roast lamb bone represents offerings to god Jewish people made when worshipping god.

Maror - a bitter herb represents the sufferings of the Jewish people in Egypt.

Charoset - Pasta with apples, walnuts and wine. Means the hard work that the slaves put in in Egypt.

Charzet - bitter herb reminds people of the hard work slaves put in in Egypt.








Maror - It is a bitter food which is a symbol of suffering in Egypt.

Ze'ro'a - Ze'ro'a is a roasted lamb bone. It is important to the Jews because Moses made a lamb sacrifice to the gods.

Chezeret - Reminds people of the suffering slaves in Egypt.

Beitzar - Beitzar is a hard boiled egg. The egg represents the offerings Jews made to god.

Seder Plate

Beitzah - a hard-boiled egg.
Meaning... represents the offerings Jewish people made to god as part of their worship.


Karpas - a vegetable dipped in salt water.
Meaning... Karpas is a small slice of vegetable which is dipped in salt water. This reminds people of the tears the slaves would have shed.

Chazeret - a bitter herb, usually romaine lettuce.
Meaning... It reminds people of the about the suffering of the slaves in Egypt.

Maror - a bitter herb made from horseradish.
Meaning... It is a symbol of the suffering of the Jewish people in Egypt.

Ze'ro'a - a roasted lamb bone.
Meaning... It is a symbol of the offerings Jewish people made to god as part of their worship.




Charoset - a paste of apples, walnuts and wine.
Meaning... It remind people of the mortar (road) that the Jewish slaves had to use when building things in Egypt.



Beitzah - A hard boiled egg. The meaning of the hard boiled egg is to show the worship to the Jewish god.

Karpas - A vegetable dipped in salt water. The meaning of karpas is to show the sweat and tears of the slaves.

Ze'ro'a - Roasted lamb bone. The meaning of Ze'ro'a is to show the sacrifices.

Beitzah - a hard-boiled egg.
Meaning... The egg represents the offering Jewish people made to God.


Karpas - a vegetable dipped in salt water.

Meaning... It is a symbol of the offering the Jewish people made to God as part of their worship to him.

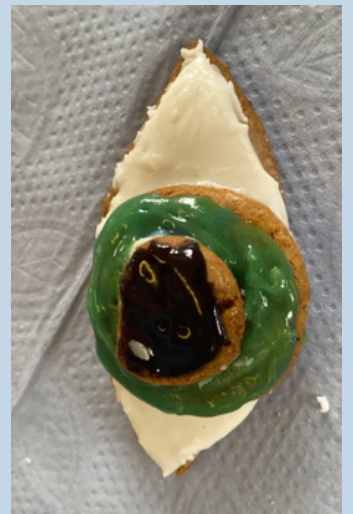

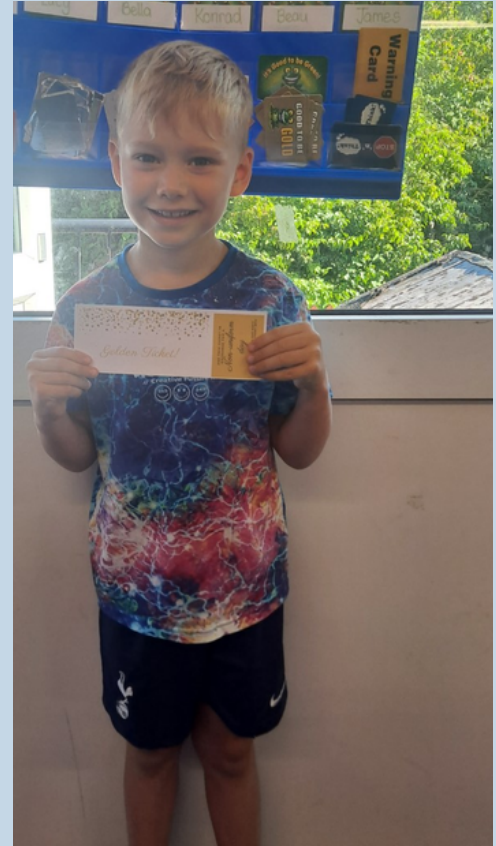
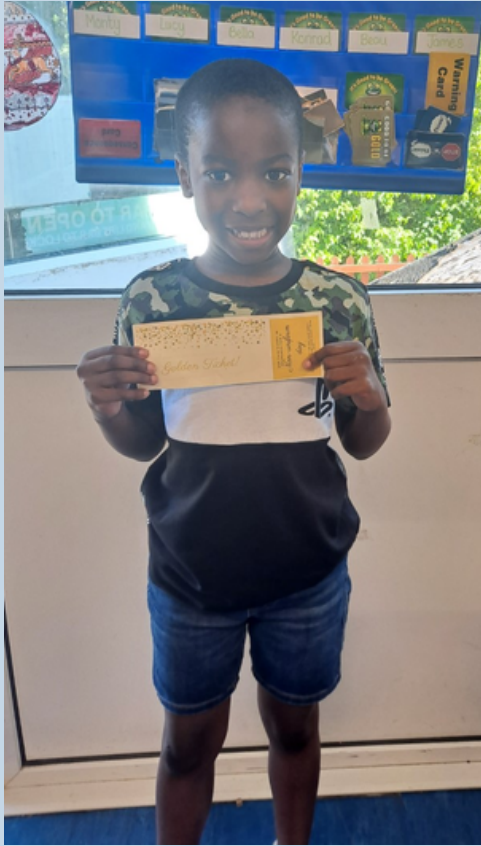
