
LEARNING IN THE WILLOWS

The children in Willows have been enjoying their maths learning and have already impressed Mrs Foster with their number counting and pattern recognition. They have been looking at number patterns on dice, dominos, playing cards and other mathematical resources and can either count the dots accurately or immediately recognise which number they can see. Shells and other natural resources have been used to match the numbers from a dice. They used playdough (which they had previously made in the classroom) to recreate the amount shown on a playing card, and some children even copied the pattern exactly.

How do some of the children immediately know what some of the dice patterns are? Max: "Three on each side so that makes 6"

Benji: "That's two on each side that makes four."













LEARNING IN THE SILVER BIRCHES

Over the past couple of weeks, Silver Birches have been studying poetry and the different features used. We have created our own poems inspired by fireworks and waterfalls. We have enjoyed experimenting using techniques such as repetition, onomatopoeia and rhyme. We also had fun experimenting to see how the way we present our poems can add emphasis and impact how it is read or performed.
