The winning design will be used as the parish card this year and will be delivered to households throughout the parish!



Key Stage 2 really enjoyed having the author, illustrator and comedian, Olaf Falafel, visit the school. He shared with us what he's done throughout his career and how he became a children's author. He has written several picture books and just released his first book for KS2 children called, 'Trixie Pickle Art Avenger'. Through the book and through his Art Club videos, he also teaches children about different artists. He was very inspiring and all the pupils enjoyed drawing one of his characters, the 'Bum Faced Snail'.

LEARNING IN THE WILLOWS

This week the children have been reading Handa's Surprise by Eileen Browne. They enjoyed seeing the animals helping themselves to the different fruits in Handa's basket without her noticing. They have all made their own mask based on the animals in the book, and will be acting out the entire story at the end of the week. They sounded out the name 'Handa' and wrote it down, as well as thinking about their favourite fruit and using word mats to help them write it out. Each child attempted to write in a speech bubble, imagining what the different characters could be saying on each page. Already the children are discovering that they can start applying their new phonics knowledge when writing out words, and they are seeing already how much their letter formation is becoming more accurate the more they practise.
