The Willows have been reading Handa's Surprise by Eileen Browne and discovered how the different animals took the fruits from the basket without Handa noticing.

They have each made an animal mask which was used to perform the story at the end of the week, using real fruits as props. They were then given the opportunity to experience some of the fruits that the animals took from Handa's basket. There were some excellent observations and comments as they investigated the textures, smells, and taste of each fruit.



Describing the banana inside: "Slippery" - Max. ""Yummy!" -Mihail. "It smells a bit funny" -Abigail.

Describing the shape of a pear: "It's straight with a big bump at the end.... like a parachute going down" - Jack

"It's slimy inside and dry outside" - Isobel.

"It feels cold" - Petar.

"Soft on the inside and hard on the outside" - Isla

Describing an orange: "It feels like there's a hole in the middle....where the stalk goes" - Max

"...on the tree" - Petar

Inside the orange: "It's where the juice comes out" - Isla.

"J for juice!" - Benji.

"When you squeeze it, it makes juice". - Aoife

"There's a skin" - Hunie.

"Hands feel sticky" - Petar.

"Sour" - Aoife.

We compared our green mango to the one in the book:

"Not red" - Petar.

Poppies
We wear poppies on Remembrance Day to remember the military personnel who died in the war. Poppies grow in the fields and cemeteries. Poppies are red, green, and black.

Soldiers
In the war, soldiers had to fight a plan to stop. Soldiers use chili and some soldiers are more successful and called troops.

Remembrance
We remember the army on November 11th and we have a minute silence to remember all the troops.

11th NOVEMBER: REMEMBRANCE DAY 

Remembrance day is on the 11th November (Friday) which is when the First World War ended (in 1918). Remembrance Day was first celebrated in 1919 just a year after the war officially ended. It was first known as "Armistice Day".

Remembrance Day is a day when we remember any we have died in the war with a two-minute silence at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th Month. We use poppies to symbolize Remembrance Day, since they are the flowers that grew on the battlefields after World War One ended.



- The Sunday before Remembrance Day is called Remembrance Sunday.
- Remembrance Day was started by King George V.
- Thanksgiving Day used to be on the same day as Remembrance Day.
- The official motto for Remembrance Day is: "They shall not grow old as we that are left grow old: Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun in the morning, We will remember them."


Remembrance day

What is Remembrance day?
Remembrance day marks the very day that world war one ended in 1918. We hold a two minute silence at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month to remember those who have died in any conflict.

Why do people wear poppies?
A remembrance poppy is an artificial worn in remembrance to commemorate their military personnel who died in war.

What is remembrance day in the UK?
On the second of Sunday of each November the Queen leads the whole nation in remembering those who have died in world wars and other conflicts.

The significance of Remembrance Day is when a 2 minute silence at 11am on the 11/11/22 (on what year it is). Remembrance Sunday is marked each year and it's on the 2nd Sunday in November.

What is it all about day 2022

The first unit was often known as WW1 or WW1 and sometimes called the Great War. Started on the 28th July 1914 and ended on the 11 November 1918. It was the first time for five years.

Who started it?
Although Austria-Hungary, Franz Ferdinand was the main provocation to the start of World War 1. The Nazis wanted the French.

11 The soldiers lived in trenches and the most common injury in the war were shells and bullets. French lost about an estimated 3,000 men and 75,000 British soldiers during WW1.
