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
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If you pay using Arbor your children will not have to queue after school!

LEARNING IN THE WILLOWS

The Willows children were delighted to see that a spaceship had landed in their classroom over the holidays. They have been inside, flying off to the moon and other distant planets, plotting their journey and trying out all the important equipment that is essential for space travel. There has been some excellent model making of rockets and aliens, with some of the children trying out a new technique to join parts, by cutting slits to insert the card.

They have also watched some real astronauts to find out how and why people and objects move differently in space, and what happens when they try to eat, drink or wash their hair on the International Space Station.

Aoife: They catch it in their mouths when it's floating because it flies out of their hands.

Isobel: They use special soap and a towel and a brush when they wash their hair. The water...they float out of her hair...the bubbles.. and they have to try and catch them.

Skip: They can play tennis - they turned upside down.

Petar: They fly around...there's no gravity.

Mihail: When you're in the rocket you can see the whole Earth.

Jack: The space suit is something you can breathe in. The space boots are heavy and it helps you stay down on the moon. They have really big sunglasses so you can go close to the sun.


Isla: They can jump in their suits when they're out on the moon.

Benji: Their hair is a little bit wonky when it's going up!































LEARNING IN THE ROWANS
